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1 General

1.1 Introduction

In the context of 3 UK onshore Wind Farms, Vattenfall is looking for a supplier for Statutory inspections. We are interested in engaging with suppliers who have proven track record in the field and can offer relevant expertise and practical solutions. The 3 projects are located across the UK, namely England, South Wales and Scotland. The commencement of the works is planned in March 2026.

1.2 Purpose of the procedure

The purpose of the indicative tender published on Energy Pathfinder is to identify qualified suppliers with the necessary expertise and capabilities to become potential partners for Vattenfall.

2 Description

2.1 General information

Only suppliers with a proven track record in the energy sector or related industries—and a strong commitment to Health and Safety compliance (preferably with experience in Onshore Wind)—are invited to participate and submit the requested information. Contractors must also demonstrate solid knowledge of relevant regulations, including:

- Lifting Operations and Lifting Equipment Regulations (LOLER)
- Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations (PUWER)
- Work at Height Regulations
- Applicable British Standards

2.2 Scope

The scope covers:

- Turbines and associated systems such as fall arrest anchors, service lifts, powered hoists, and emergency evacuation kits;
- Lifting and climbing equipment including ropes, pulleys, and stretchers;
- Safety and emergency provisions such as first aid kits, eyewash stations, defibrillators, and grab bags;
- Electrical and calibrated tools including PAT testing;
- Pressurised systems for brake and pitch control; and
- Personal protective equipment (PPE) and rescue gear.
- Additional requirements include inspection of O&M building assets, warehouse equipment, and meteorological masts. Services must ensure compliance with statutory intervals, typically six-monthly or annual checks, with specific cycles for pressurized systems, emergency lighting, and AED components.

The contractor is also required to provide and maintain all necessary documentation and reporting—including H&S plans, risk assessments, method statements, incident and environmental reporting—and to ensure all personnel (including subcontractors) are competent and appropriately trained. All work must comply with Vattenfall’s Health & Safety and Environmental policies, including requirements for waste management, spill response, and ecological protection.

3 Instructions for Interested Suppliers

3.1 Submission documentation

Interested suppliers should send the following:

- The services offered by your company
- Details of experience and track record
- Summary of similar work you have completed on other projects including the duration and overall value of the contract
- Number of site based management staff.

3.3 English language

All communication must be carried out in English, unless Vattenfall states otherwise, or gives its prior written approval to a candidate to communicate (partially) in another language.

3.4 Confidentiality

All information and documentation provided by Vattenfall in the context of this market consultation must be treated as confidential. Candidates will restrict access to these materials solely to employees who require it for their work and who have been informed of the confidentiality requirements regarding Vattenfall. Vattenfall will also maintain the confidentiality of all the documents received.

4 Application for the market consultation

4.1 Submission of documents

All answers to the questions and documents must be submitted via email.

4.2 Questions

Questions may be submitted via email until the deadline specified in Section 1.3 herein.

4.3 Final date of submission

The deadline for submission follows the date and time specified in Section 1.3 of the planning. Candidates are responsible for submitting their applications on time. A valid application should be sent via email to the contact person listed in Section 1.4

5 Consultation process

5.1 Intention of Consultation

As outlined earlier, this early Market Consultation aims to encourage proactive engagement with the market and foster dialogue, ensuring that when the formal tender is launched, we have identified and invited capable, qualified suppliers with the appropriate expertise.
